

**NOTES FROM FR. JIM:**

The California Bishops have designated June 10th, Corpus Christi Sunday, as the day to highlight the necessity for comprehensive national immigration reform - which we as Church, support. The California Bishops are encouraging all pastors to use the occasion of the Feast of Corpus Christi to reflect on the struggle of immigrants, pray for a just reform and urge parishioners to take action.

**Our Catholic Social Justice Teaching on Migration:**

1. People have the right to find opportunities in their homeland.
2. People have the right to migrate to support themselves and their families.
3. Sovereign nations have the right to control their borders.
4. Refugees and asylum seekers should be afforded protection.
5. The human dignity and human rights of the undocumented migrants should be respected.

In the midst of the current political debate on this matter it is important to remember that the Catholic Church does **not** support illegal immigration, but rather, supports a path to legal residency which has fair requirements such as background checks, reasonable fines, back taxes, and learning English.

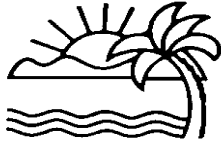

**Question for Adults:** How can you show compassion toward the marginalized members of society today?  
**Question for Youth:** Jesus was able to see the faith of the woman, even though she was a sinner. Who is in need of your forgiveness, even though they have done you harm? What is one way that you can offer forgiveness to someone in the weeks to come?  
**Question for Children:** This week, how can you welcome someone at school or in your neighborhood who is feeling left out?

**HOPE AND FORGIVENESS**

There were some interesting conceptions of sin prevalent in the time of the Hebrew scriptures. There was the belief that God punished sin immediately. Those who suffered disease or misfortune were, therefore, sinners getting their due from the Almighty.

Today’s first reading hints at another kind of God. When David admits his sin, Nathan declares, “The LORD on his part has forgiven your sin” (2 Samuel 12:13b). Here was not a vengeful God but a merciful God. What good news that must have been to David and those who, like him, could be honest enough to admit their sinfulness!

Jesus is the good news of God’s mercy and forgiveness incarnate. Without Jesus, perhaps the good news would have been too good to believe, too difficult to imagine. But there he is in today’s Gospel, the God-man, forgiving a sinner and declaring that she is forgiven because of her great love.

**TODAY’S READINGS**

**First Reading** — The Lord forgives David for taking the wife of Uriah, and for having Uriah killed (2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13).  
**Psalms** — Lord, forgive the wrong I have done (Psalm 32)  
**Second Reading** — If justification comes through the law, then Christ died for nothing (Galatians 2:16, 19-21).  
**Gospel** — Jesus forgives the woman because of her great love (Luke 7:36 — 8:3 [7:36-50]).
